Programs and Services

Child Welfare Services

Foster Family Care Program – CSSWC foster families provide temporary homes for abused and/or neglected children. In safe and caring licensed homes, foster families provide warmth, love, attention and security.

Semi Independent Living Program – As an alternative to foster care, CSSWC offers adolescents a program that focuses on increasing the individual's daily living skills, vocational skills, social skills, community integrations, and financial literacy skills.

Foster Home Licensing – If you are interested in being a champion for a child in need, become a licensed foster parent. Foster Parent Orientation and PRIDE Training are required to initiate the process and are offered monthly.

Teen Infant Parenting Services (TIPS) – Teen Infant Parenting Services (TIPS) is a transitional housing program with the capacity to serve 16 homeless mothers and their children in an apartment style setting. The comprehensive program provides a variety of support services including parenting education, basic life skills, individual and group counseling, support for completion of high school and career training.



Programs and Services Continued

Behavioral Health and Community Services

Substance Abuse Treatment and Prevention Programs – Substance Abuse programs focus on outpatient care for adult alcoholics, drug abusers and their families

W.A.R. Program – Worthy Able and Ready (W.A.R) program helps ease the transition of returning citizens age 18 and older re-entering into society from prison. The program assists citizens to secure employment, housing and obtain proper identification including Social Security Cards, Birth Certificates, etc.

Senior/Volunteer Services

Foster Grandparent Program (FGP) – Since 1965, Foster Grandparents devote their volunteer service entirely toward disadvantaged or disabled youth.

Senior Companion Program (SCP) – Senior Companion Program began with CSSWC in 1974 and is a national older adult volunteer program designed for seniors to help other seniors maintain independent living.

Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) – Since 1973, RSVP connects volunteers age 55 and over with service opportunities in their communities that match their skills and availability.

Education and Literacy Programs

I Know Right (IKR) Reading Programs – Literacy programs serve all learners in an environment where academic success and life success walk hand-in-hand. Working directly with parents, schools and the community, CSSWC's literacy programs seek to assist learners of all ages achieve academic success and reach their highest potential in life through knowledge.
